

## **2018 Election Supervisory Board**

### **In Res. Multiple Candidates ESB Resolution: 2018-003**

Election Supervisory Board Chair Jennifer Valdez deliver the majority opinion of the board:

“In the matter of multiple candidates of failure to submit timely financial disclosures.”

Whereas, Section 7.17 of the Campus-wide Election Cod reads, “FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENT.” Financial disclosure statements shall be filed with the Election Supervisory Board, on the online google form, posted on <http://deanofstudents.utexas.edu/campuswideelections/>, at the following times: (a) By 4:30 PM CST, on the first day of campaigning and, (b) By 4:30pm CST, on the last day of the second week of campaigning; and, (c) By 4:30pm CST, on the last day before the general or special election; and, (d) By 4:30pm CST, on the first day of campaigning in a runoff election; and, (e) By 4:30pm CST, on the last day of voting in a runoff elections,” and,

Whereas, Failure to submit timely financial disclosures is punishable by the ESB sua sponte as outlined in Madison Gardner/Antonio Guevara v. the Election Supervisory Board (Docket Number: 2012SE-005); and,

Whereas, The Election Supervisory Board has voted to assess a Class B Violation resulting in a moratorium of campaigning to the candidates who failed to submit the second financial disclosure in a timely fashion; and, therefore, be it,

Whereas, Section 4.16 of the Campus-wide Election Code reads,  
“CONSEQUENCES OF A CLASS B OR C VIOLATION. If Election Supervisory Board finds a candidate, or a candidate’s agents or workers, has committed a Class B or Class C violation, the Election Supervisory Board may restrict the candidate, or the candidate’s agents or workers, from engaging in some or all campaign activities for some or all of the remainder of the campaign period. If an order is issued covering only part of the remaining campaign period, it shall take effect within twenty-four (24) hours so that after its termination, the candidate will have an opportunity to resume campaigning during the days immediately prior to and including the election days; therefore, be it,

Resolved, That the following candidates are hereby issued a Class B violation of a campaign moratorium beginning at 8AM Monday, February 26, 2018 and ending at 8AM Tuesday, February 27, 2018:
