

## 2019 Election Supervisory Board

### In Re: Sanctioned Campaign Activity

#### ESB Resolution: 2019-003

Election Supervisory Board Member Nicholas Eastwood delivered the majority opinion of the board:

*“In the matter of a campaign failing to adhere to Section 4.17 Sanctioned Campaign Activity of the Student Government election code.”*

*Whereas*, Section 4.17 of the Student Government Election Code reads “all electioneering activities of a candidate and/or his/her respective campaign staff must adhere to the parameters set forth by this code, the Student Government Constitution, University policy, system rules, state and federal law, and any other established policy applicable to the actions in question.”

*Whereas*, Failure to adhere to the parameters set forth by the Student Activity Center is punishable by the ESB as outlined in the Student Government Election Code; and,

*Whereas*, Section 4.17 of the SAC Policies & Procedures Manual states, “due to limited space within the Student Activity Center, tabling or handing out promotional materials will not be allowed in the Student Activity Center.”

*Whereas*, Tabling is defined by the Office of the Dean of Students as “to display literature, distribute information and for other forms of expression.”

*Whereas*, The Election Supervisory Board has voted to issue a Class-B violation as defined by Section 4.12 of the Campus-Wide Election Code to all individuals confirmed as directly involved in the act of tabling within the SAC; and, therefore, be it,

*Resolved*, That the following individuals hereby are placed on a 24-hour campaigning moratorium beginning at 8:00 AM Monday, February 25, 2019 and ending at 8:00 AM Tuesday February 26, 2019.

*Resolved*, That any adversely affected party has the right to appeal this decision pursuant to Section 5.1 of the Campus-Wide Election Code, which reads, “APPEAL OF ESB DECISION: Any party adversely affected by a decision of the Election Supervisory Board may file an appeal with the entity with appellate jurisdiction within twenty-four (24) hours after the adverse decision is announced, unless the Election Supervisory Board’s decision takes place during a voting period.”

*In conclusion*, The Election Supervisory Board submits its resolution on Saturday, February 23, 2019, with the majority of board members who were present at the meeting.
